## Checklist on health insurance abroad From Germany abroad

## Employees and freelancers require for temporary stays in the EU...

- → the European Health Insurance Card from the statutory health insurance company in order to see a doctor
- → a A1 Certificate to show that they pay compulsory social security in their country of residence. Possibly authorities, employers, or event organizers abroad will ask for this form.
- → an additional international health insurance policy for special treatment. (Not necessarily; please ask your health insurance company for further information!)

## In cases of temporary stays outside of the EU, ...

- → please check if there is a Social Security Agreement between Germany and the country of destination.
- →please obtain information on insurance cover from the Artists' Social Fund (*Künstlersozialkasse*) or your health insurance company.
- → please take out an international health insurance policy, if necessary; some countries require proof that you have health insurance before they issue a visa.

## **Tips**

- → Information sheets on individual countries (<u>www.dvka.de</u>) are available (*in German*) from the German Liaison Agency Health Insurance International.
- → Private health cover is generally valid across Europe. Outside Europe, it is valid for at least one month. This period can be extended for an extra fee.
